
Siblings

I think siblings have different types of relationships with each other. I think that some siblings fight with each other and some siblings get along with each other. My sister and I don't always fight, we also get along with each other.



Siblings have different types of relationships with each other. Some siblings get along with each other. My sister and I don't always fight, we also get along with each other.


