You can make pretty much anything you could think of in the world and if you made a car with the right pieces it could even move.

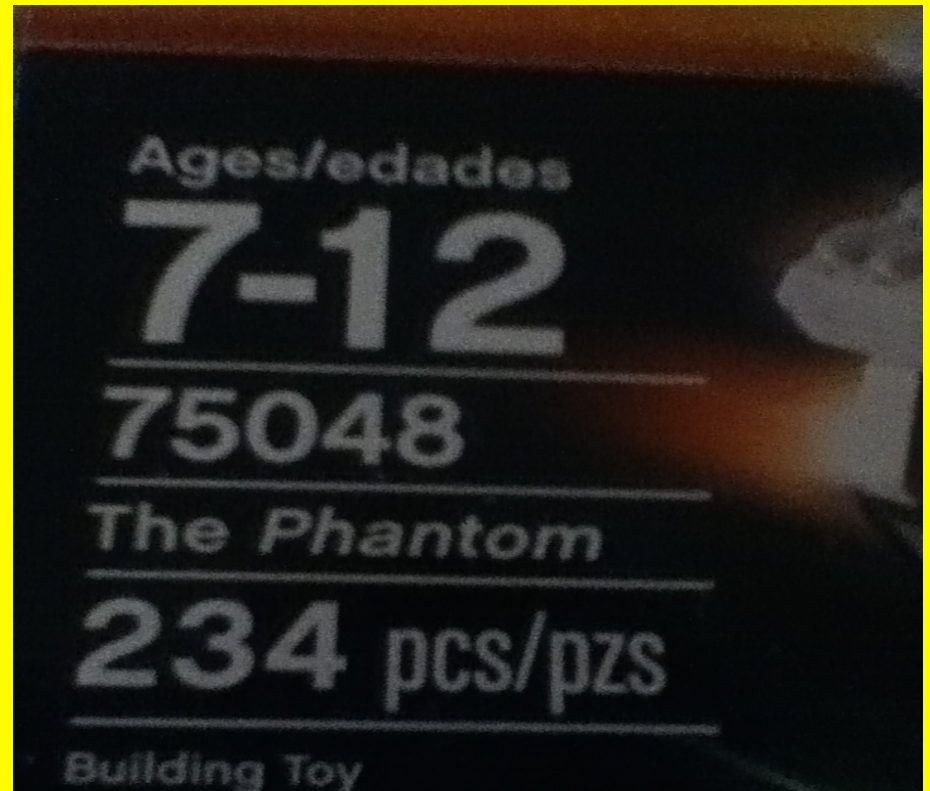
You can even make working or moving objects you even make a working bicycle.
