The first native New Yorkers were the Lenape. The island of Manhattan called New Amsterdam. In 1626, the settlement's governor general, Peter Minuit, purchased Manhattan Island from the natives. As the city grew, it made other improvements. In 1811, the "Commissioner's Plan" established an orderly grid of streets and avenues for the undeveloped parts of Manhattan north of Houston Street. In 1837, construction began on the Croton Aqueduct, which provided clean water for the city's growing population. Eight years after that, the city established its first municipal agency with was the New York City Police Department.
