ANIMAL TESTING

HOW MANY ANIMALS DIE A YEAR?

Millions and millions of animals die a year. More than 15 million cold blooded animals alone get tested a year. Much more than 100 million animals die a year. It's impossible to know how many animals die a year because there are so many. 90 % of rats and mice are used for animal testing.
