

This imperial Roman coin was handcrafted between the years 337-361. This was also the time of Constaintanius 2 ruler. This is over 1000 years old.


My Mom had purchased this 18 years ago. She knows the Roman empire inside and out this helped her understanding.

He had came out in 1969 in a captain America comic. Then later renamed his own series The Falcon. Afterwards he became a lot more popular he appeared in movies, video games etc.


My dad the man who had bough this particular comic. He says "
