Child Abuse

The Problem with Child

Abuse Child abuse is a very serious thing that happens a lot. Three million child abuse reports are heard every year, and reported every 10 seconds. Every day in the United States, more then 3 children die and most of those children are younger then 5

years old. But there is more than hurting a child. There are a lot other types of abuses that happen.

The Types of Child Abuse

One is physical abuse. It's when a parent/caregiver physically harms a child.

It may happen when a child is punished harshly, even if the adult didn't even mean to do it. Physical abuse is also serious when a child is bruised. It can even damage the child. Or even worse, they might even die.

Sexual abuse is when an adult involves a child in a sexual act. It's usually someone they trust.

Neglect

Neglect is when an adult doesn't give a child the proper emotional and physical needs for a regular basis. For example: not giving the proper food, clothing, supervision, safe surroundings, housing, health, medical care, emotional care, and education for the child.

A child who is neglected physically and emotionally can not develop properly. Some children may have permanent damage.

Emotional

Emotional abuse is when an adult rejects, criticizes, insults, humiliates, terrorizes, isolates, or corrupts a child.


Teens Being Abused
