MORE ABOUT MORMONS

Mormonism is a religion that is 200 years old, founded in 1830. There are things that have stayed the same and things that have changed. For example, Mormons used to practice Polygamy and, now they don't. Or, Mormons still choose to live by a "code" called The Word of Wisdom. The Word of Wisdom is a guideline for healthy living.

For example, The Word of Wisdom suggests that one should use tobacco for healing of animals on the outside but not for humans inside. It also suggests not to drink any alcohol. Some other things the Word of Wisdom suggests are to eat meat sparingly and to eat fruits and vegetables in season and to eat Grains. Well, that's it, that's a Mormon!
