Flowers



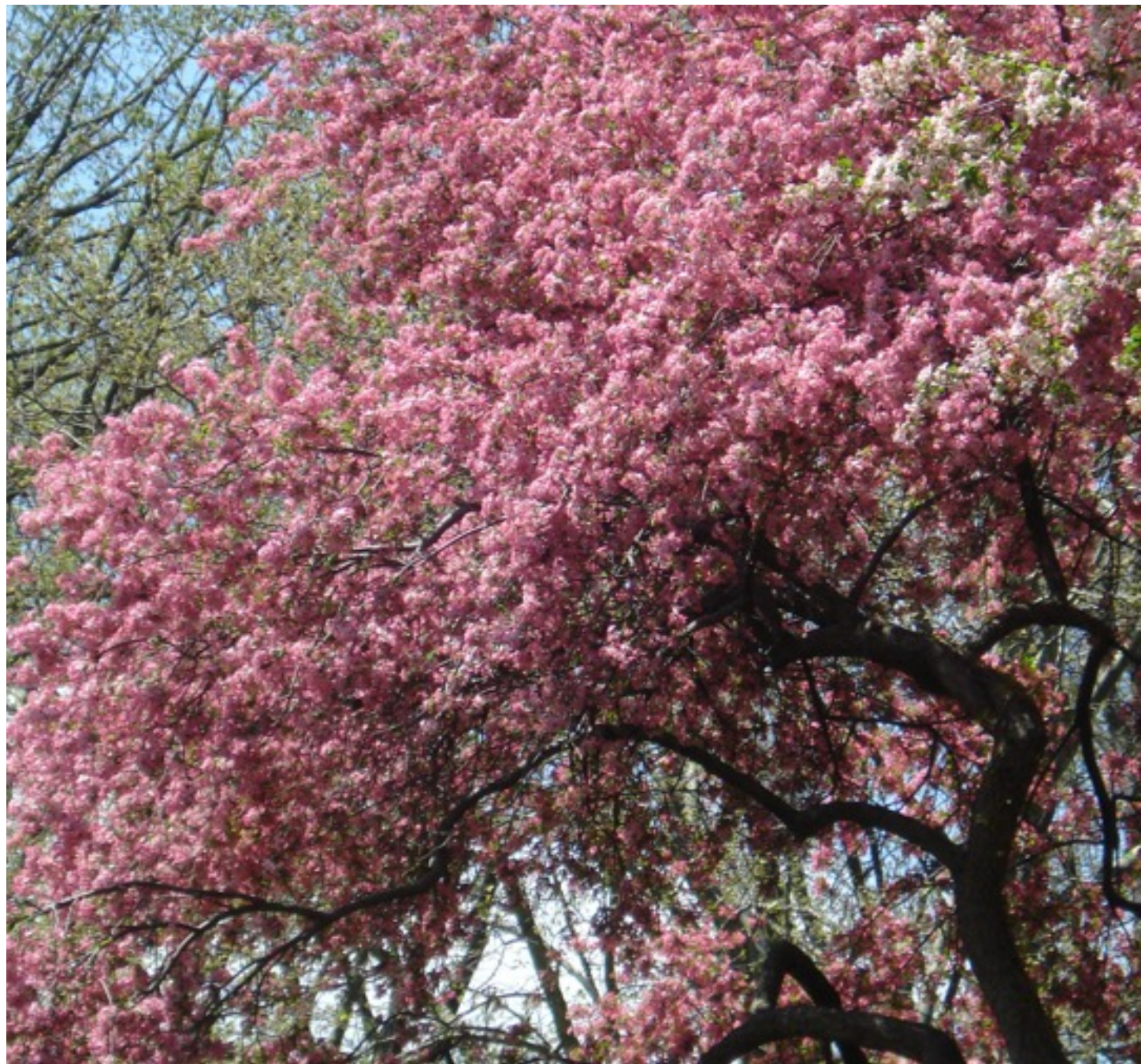
